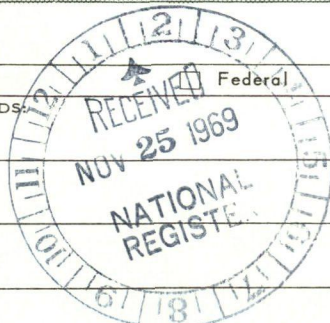

DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (if known) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The Old Bakery Building, built in 1876, is a small two story commercial building with a brick and limestone front and brick and rubble sides. It is situated at the head of Congress Avenue close to the capitol. The brick is a tan color and the limestone trim in the voussoirs, moldings, keystones and bands is a grey white. The three first floor openings have segmental arches. The second story door and windows are round arched with somewhat gothic molding strips above the voussoirs. A brick gable has a stepped brick design under the eaves and the top is crowned with a handsome stone eagle with outstretched wings. A slightly foreign handling of the proportions probably reflects the first owners' Swedish background. Originally there was a traditional one story flat awning where there now is a wrought iron balcony.

The interior walls are painted brick and there is a pressed tin ceiling. An old oven remains. The first floor is divided into two rooms, the back room raised a half flight of stairs because the lot slopes sharply down to the street. The second story once was living quarters. A storeroom remains at the rear of the building.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

In 1876 Charles Lundberg built what is now called the Old Bakery Building. According to the March 26, 1876 edition of the Austin Statesman the building was as noteworthy then as it is today. The paper described how "a large (stone) eagle, with outstretched wings, and carved out of solid stone by that excellent mechanic, Mr. John Didelot, was yesterday elevated to the top of Mr. Lundberg's bakery building, at the head of the Avenue. Mr. L. is sparing no pains or expense in fitting up the most tasty and attractive bakery and confectionery in the South." Charles Lundberg came to the United States from Sweden in 1863 and in 1872 he moved to Austin where he became a journeyman in the bakery business. A year or two later he bought out his employer. "From that day," according to Lundberg's obituary, "he conducted the largest and most successful bakery in Austin." When he died in 1895, his widow sold the business to Henry Maerki, a Swiss National, and a partner. By 1898 Maerki was the sole owner of the bakery where he and his wife Lillie made their home. In 1906, before taking his family back to his fatherland, Maerki sold the business to George Siglhofer, whose name appears in the cement sidewalk in front of the building.

For sixty years the little building housed a succession of independent bakers who supplied fresh bread and cakes to Austinites as well as for visitors on their way to the Capitol. Specialties of the Lundberg Bakery were: five inch long ladyfingers, almond meal macaroons, glazed kisses, and Sally bread. From 1883 to 1899 the temporary State Capitol at Eleventh and Congress was located next to the bakery. Although various business interests occupied the Old Bakery Building after 1937, it was used last as a nightclub. Until 1962 it was vacant and deteriorating; at that time the Heritage Society of Austin bought and restored it along with the aid of the Junior League of Austin. The Heritage Society Guild directed restoration of the building which they opened to the

The State Of Texas acquired the Old Bakery in February, 1970, and the Highway Department planned to tear down all the structures on the block and build a multi-storied office building. There was such a public outcry, however, that the Legislature voted in 1973 that there could be no development on the site. The Bakery was saved, but the adjoining buildings on the south were razed. In 1974 the vacant lots on either side of the Bakery were landscaped as a public park. The State still owns the building and is presently lending it to the Austin Bicentennial Commission as their headquarters.

Enclosed is a copy of the 1969 National Register form. I will send you copies of the old photographs as soon as they are processed. In addition, we will send you new pictures showing the present condition of the building in relation to the park.
