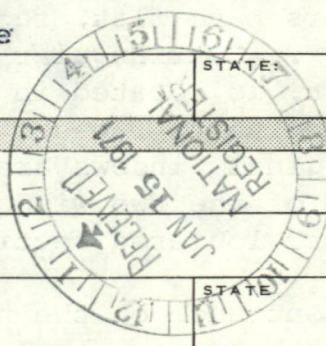

DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (if known) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The Magoffin Homestead is a fourteen-room adobe structure located on a 1.5 acre site, ten blocks east of the central business district of El Paso. The Homestead, erected in 1875, is a one-story, U-shaped house built around a central patio. The front wing of the homestead measures 103.5 feet by 38 feet. The rear wing is 60 feet by 19 feet and the two wings are connected by a perpendicular wing approximately 60 feet by 19 feet.

Ceilings throughout the structure are 14 feet high. The house is roofed with a one-foot thickness of water-proofed adobe. Ceilings are surfaced with either 3½-inch tongue-in-groove panelling or the older, more primitive woven or thatched construction. The roofing material is supported by 3-inch by 12-inch rafters or vigas 18-inch centers. A two-foot adobe parapet surmounts the walls. Metal canales or downspouts project for drainage of each of the wings.

An inventory of rooms and facilities under the common roof include a 15-foot by 15-foot kitchen, six bedrooms of varying sizes, a 15-foot by 30-foot hall or entry way, a 15-foot by 26-foot library, three baths of varying sizes, a 15-foot by 15-foot trophy room and a maid's room and garage. All of the principal rooms have fireplaces.

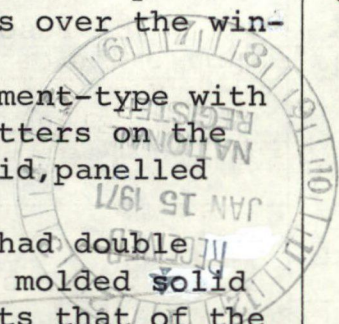
A unique feature of the Magoffin Homestead is the elaborate architectural detail in the Victorian style which decorates all the fenestrations of the original portion of the house. Windows and doors on the front wing have pedimented lintels. The pediments and returns are formed by a generous cyma reversa molding. The windows and doors have flat, fascia-board pilasters on each side of the openings. A triangular panel, raised to a point in pyramidal fashion, is located in the pediments over the windows and doors on the north facade.

All of the original windows are wooden casement-type with four lights in each of the two windows. The shutters on the windows have an upper louvered section and a solid, panelled lower section.

The principal entrance on the north facade had double entrance doors with the upper panel glazed and a molded solid lower panel. The design of the sidelights repeats that of the door, with a molded panel below the glazed panels. A transom extends the width of both the doors and sidelights. The glazed panes of the transom are of colored glass. The south doorway of the entrance hall, which opens onto the patio, is similar to that of the north entrance with glazed double doors, sidelights and a transom.

A visual inspection of the structure and aerial photographs of the roof fabric support the supposition that the Magoffin

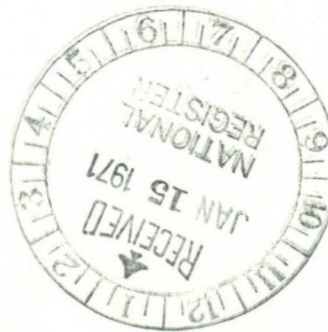

Homestead may have originally consisted of the north wing of the present complex, measuring roughly 80 feet by 38 feet. The west section of the south wing (a structure 45 feet by 19 feet) would appear to have been the original detached kitchen building. The original house or north wing has a symmetrically arranged floor plan about a central hall which extends the width of the structure. The north or principal facade of the homestead was also symmetrical with two windows on each side of the nearly central main doorway.

The approximately 22-foot wide addition on the east end of the north wing would seem to be an erection post-dating the main block of the north wing. This room which adds both a window and a door to the north facade, alters the symmetry of this facade. The architectural detail on this door and window are similar to those on what is thought to be the original portion of the north facade; however the proportions of the pedimented lintel are significantly different. The center raised panel is omitted and the apertures are not flanked by fascia-board pilasters covering the jambs.

It would seem that the east or connecting wing which is 122.6 feet long was added to connect the rear kitchen with the main block of the homestead. This long wing, judging from the fabric of the roof, quite possibly could have been constructed in several stages.

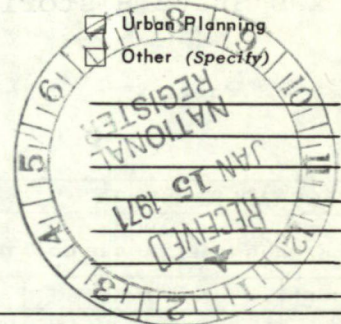

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

Joseph Magoffin, son of Maria Gertrudis (Valdez) and James Wiley Magoffin, was born on January 14, 1837, in Chihuahua, Mexico, where his father was United States Consul. The family moved to Independence, Missouri, in 1844. Young Magoffin was educated in Lexington, Kentucky, and St. Louis, Missouri. In 1856 he joined his father at the present site of El Paso, Texas, where he had settled after the Mexican War.

The Magoffins were militant supporters of the secession. Joseph Magoffin had varied experiences in the Confederate Army. He was a major on the staff of H. H. Sibley in the New Mexico campaign, served in Virginia and fought in the Battle of Seven Pines, and was sent to Marshall, Texas, to secure supplies. After the close of the war he returned to El Paso and succeeded to his father's estate in 1868. After considerable difficulty, he recovered much of his father's property that had been confiscated during the early period of Radical control of the area. As in the days of his father, "Don Santiago", the Magoffin home continued to be the center of social life of El Paso and Fort Bliss.

Magoffin, a successful business man, was director of the State National Bank. He helped organize the International Street Railway Company to unite El Paso with Juarez, Mexico, and was interested in other street railways and public utilities. A life-long and politically active Democrat, Magoffin served at various times as member of the El Paso school board, justice of the peace, and county judge. For four terms he was mayor of El Paso. President Grover Cleveland appointed him collector of the port of El Paso.

Magoffin was married in 1864 to Octavia McGrael in Houston, Texas. A son and a daughter survived to maturity. In 1875, Magoffin built the Magoffin Homestead ten blocks east of the present central business district. This large residence is a unique combination of traditional adobe architecture with elaborate wooden detailing on windows and doors in the Victorian style. Magoffin died September 27, 1923 at the home of his


Under separate cover we are forwarding corrections for the National Register submissions which were rechecked here in our office and found to be in error. I trust that this means of correction will not confuse the issue.
