DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The Giddings-Stone Mansion located in Brenham, Texas is a brick two-story transitional Greek Revival house with a two-story semi-detached service wing. Although it was basically a central hall Greek Revival plan, the house was considerably modified by the later addition of bay windows and galleries.

In 1860 Jabez Giddings, a local financier, politician, and railroad builder, laid the granite corner stone, inscribed with his name and the date, and began construction of the original block. The two-story brick structure followed the standard Greek Revival plan, with a central hall flanked by two rooms on each side. The massive brick walls of the house rest on an unusual dry wall foundation of brick, stacked several courses deep, and secured with a thick exterior coat of plaster. The walls of the first floor are four courses thick, and the second floor are three courses thick, creating a sill one brick wide on the interior, which carried the joists of the second floor.

The north or main facade of the mansion is a five bay scheme on both floors. The first floor consists of a central double door with single light fixed side lights and a tripartite transom, divided into three single lights by rusticated stone jambs. The transoms and single light doors were filled with beveled and leaded stained glass, which have disappeared. The double doors were flanked by massive brick jambs. The two windows on either side of the main entrance are triple hung six over six over six light sashes, all with rusticated stone lintels and sills. The second floor had a tripartite center window with a rusticated stone lintel and sill. The center bay of the window is a triple hung six over six over six light sash flanked by narrow triple hung two over two over two light side lights. The two flanking windows on each side of the center window have six over six light double hung sashes with the rusticated stone lintels and sills found on all of the mansion's apertures.

The interior walls are lath and plaster. The floors are pine random length center match. The interior doorways have fluted jambs and lintels of wood which intersect in patera blocks. The central hall has a fine walnut staircase which was prefabricated in St. Louis and shipped

to Brenham during the construction of the mansion. It has elaborately turned balusters and octagonal newel posts with beaded piping and finials ornamented with acanthus leaves. The octagonal bases of the newel posts are ornamented with rope braid trim, oval panels and diamond figures, on each of the eight faces of the post. The stair treads have simple mitred mouldings and the risers are expressed by jigsaw brackets.

The original block has eight fireplaces served by four end chimneys. The elaborate wooden mantels are of carved walnut, and consist of a thin, simple mantle supported by engaged colonnades. Although the motifs of the fireplaces are classical, they are combined in an eclectic manner. The composite colonnades have Ionic capitals and their bases are "wrapped" in carved acanthus leaves. They are fluted only one-third of their height. The overmantle consists of a rectangular mirror framed by simple pilasters with recessed rectangular panels, capped by patera blocks and a thin cyma-recta moulding which terminates the mirror frame.

In 1894 Giddings' son-in-law, Heber Stone, undertook an extensive remodeling of the house. When work was commenced, the second exposed face of the corner stone was inscribed with Stone's name, that of his wife and his mother-in-law, Lou Ann Giddings. In addition to the installation of a furnace, plumbing, and electrical wiring, Stone added a service ell and galleries which were executed under the supervision of architect A. O. Watson. The two-story bays, also of brick, were added on the east, west, and south sides of the house. The north side was sheltered by new double galleries supported by distinctive brickcore, cement coated columns. Although the columns were the full height of the two-story mansion their exterior cement coating was moulded to resemble two independent Tuscan columns, one above the other, giving the impression that each floor has a separate colonnade. The bases of the columns, on both levels, are of moulded brick, coated with cement. The capitals, however, are no more than wooden collars around the columns. The abacuses, echinus, and trachelions are handsomely carved and properly proportioned for the Tuscan order. Double galleries were also added to the east and south sides of the house. Identical galleries were built on the east side of the service ell and served to connect it to the main block. The galleries are supported by

attenuated wooden Tuscan columns on pedestals. All of the galleries have balustrades of machine turned wooden balusters, except for the main facade, which has a delicate cast iron railing. The eastern galleries of the service ell have an exterior staircase, and the galleries at the rear of the house were enclosed with latticework. The lattice work has almost entirely disappeared and has suffered from several storms.

The south or rear facade has an unusual pressed tin and wood frame bay window. It is stamped in imitation of the brick walls of the house and is carefully painted to match the color of the masonry. There is no bay window beneath it, and an actual brick bay window could not have been supported by the light wooden gallery into which it projects. Both the service ell and the main block have low pitched hipped roofs of standing seam tin.

The main block has a well proportioned box cornice with concealed rain gutters which feed into wall mounted drain pipes. The service ell also has a box cornice, but it is of more modest proportions, in keeping with the smaller scale of that structure.

The mansion was last occupied in 1970 by Louise Tarver Stone, granddaughter of the home's builder. The house suffered extensive damage from a 1960 hurricane which toppled one of the brick core columns. The Heritage Society of Washington County acquired the mansion in 1975 and is currently restoring it for use as a local community and fine arts center.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

The Giddings-Stone Mansion located in Brenham, Texas is a unique architectural example of the stylistic transition between Greek Revival and Victorian motifs. Built in 1870, it was the home of Jabez Demming Giddings, a pioneer railroad builder and financier.

Giddings was born in 1814, the son of a wealthy Pennsylvania merchantile family. He immigrated to the Republic of Texas in 1838 and was hired to teach school at Independence, Texas the following year. In 1842 he was appointed District Clerk for the Washington County Court at Mount Vernon, Texas where he maintained a residence until the court was moved to Brenham in 1844. Giddings had scarcely begun work for the court when he was recruited for the Sommerville Expedition in 1842. The expedition was a large raiding party which attacked towns along Mexico's northern border. Giddings also participated in the disasterous Mier expedition of 1843 which was a secondary invasion of Mexico by several of the veterans of the Sommerville expedition. Giddings was fortunate enough to escape capture although most of his compatriots were imprisoned in Mexico and eighteen were eventually executed.

Giddings made his way back to Brenham by 1844 where he met and married Anne Tarver, the sister of Texas' Attorney General. Giddings and his wife settled into the life of the town and were instrumental in the founding of Brenham's first Methodist congregation. Giddings retained a lifelong interest in the welfare of the Methodist church in Texas.

In 1846 Giddings was admitted to the Bar and began the practice of law. He established his own firm and was joined in 1854 by his brother, DeWitt Clinton Giddings, who became a partner in the firm and several of Jabez Giddings' other business ventures. He became interested in the construction of a railroad from the shipping center of Hempstead to the Capitol at Austin. In 1855 he became one of the principal investors in the Washington County Railroad, one of the very few railroads in ante-bellum Texas. The line's first locomotive bore Giddings' name and traveled over only eleven and one-half miles of track. In 1866 Giddings and his brother DeWitt Clinton Giddings organized Brenham's

first bank, the Giddings and Giddings Bank. That same year witnessed the entry of both brothers into Reconstruction politics, Jabez winning a seat in the first post-bellum legislature and chairmanship of the House Judiciary Committee, and DeWitt joining the Constitutional Convention as a delegate from Washington County.

In 1869 ^{Jabez} Jobey Giddings left politics and returned to Brenham where he acquired 320 acres upon which he built an unusual transitional Greek Revival mansion which took a year to complete. Its large rooms were the setting for frequent meetings of Methodist clergy and a local Sunday school. Giddings became a benefactor for several Methodist institutions and made large donations to the Methodist sponsored Georgetown College and Soule University.

In 1878 Giddings was killed when a frightened horse overturned his buggy in the mansion's driveway. His daughter, Mary Louise Giddings, inherited the house and together with her husband, Heber Stone, lived there until her death in 1928.

Heber Stone, like ⁸ Jobey ² Giddings, was a successful financier. He owned several cotton plantations along the Brazos River, oil wells in Corsicana, the First National Bank of Brenham, a gold mine in Nerrone State, Mexico, and a furniture factory in Brenham. Stone remodeled the mansion in 1894 making several improvements which provided the house with equipment which was very sophisticated for its location and date. A complete sewage system was installed, as well as indoor plumbing and running water. The house was wired for electricity, and a central heating system supplied by a furnace was installed. A two-story ell which housed the kitchen and serving rooms was added, under the supervision of architect A. O. Watson.

The house remained in the possession of the Stone family and was occupied by Louise Tarver Stone, Heber Stone's daughter until 1970. In 1975 it was acquired by the Heritage Society of Washington County which intends to restore the mansion and open it to the public as a social and cultural center for the county.

The commissioners examined designs submitted by eight architects and on May 10, 1895, ordered that the plan of San Antonio architect J. Riely Gordon be accepted. He was directed to develop specifications and details and to superintend the new work for a fee of 5% of the contract cost. On the 18th of May, J.A. White was awarded the contract for construction on a bid of \$95,000, with construction to begin before June 1, 1895. On January 1, 1897, the building was received by the court. Although the building interior was remodeled in 1960, it retains most of its original character on the exterior. It continues today to serve its original function.

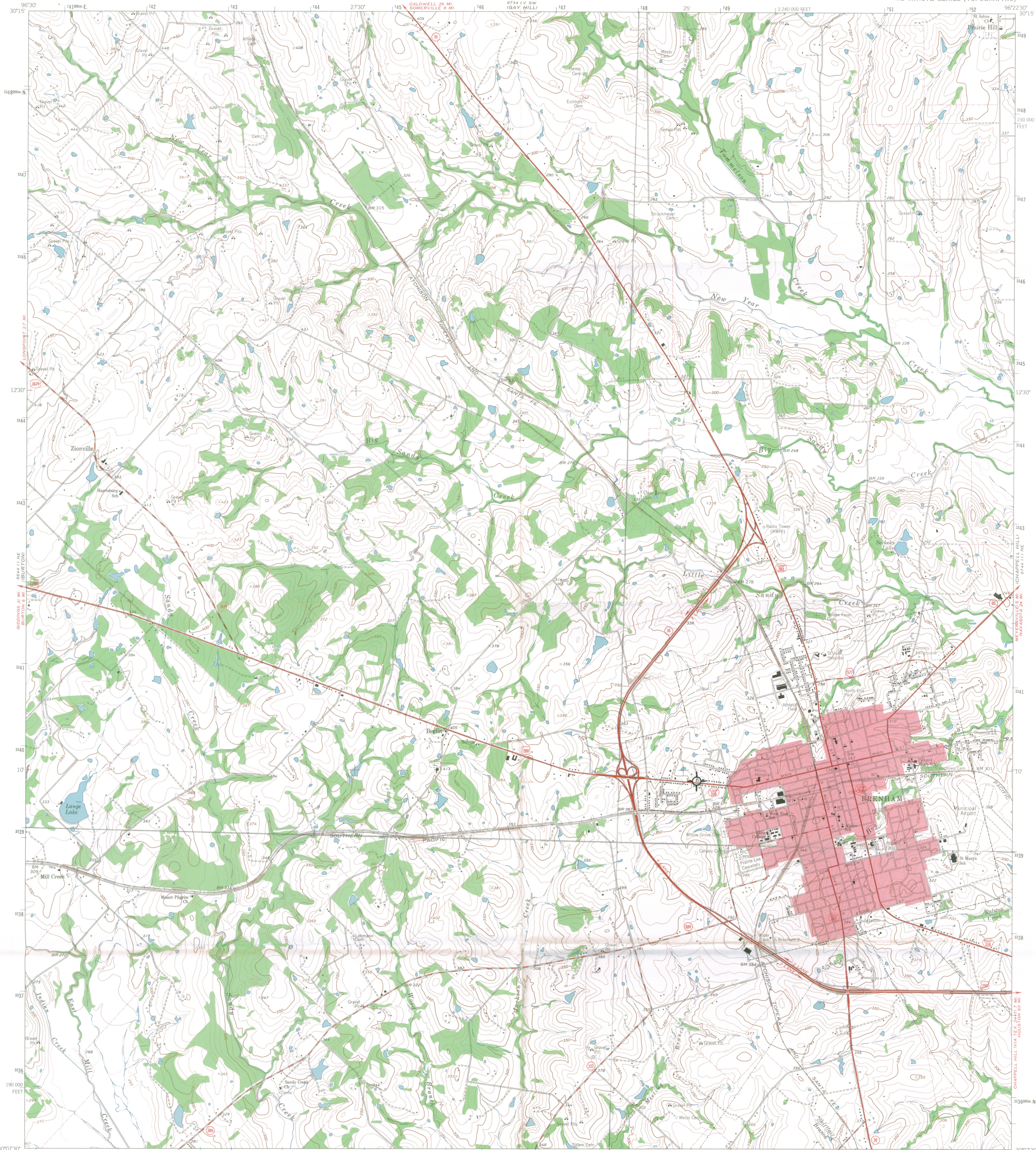

Dear Dr. Murtagh:

We would like to increase the acreage of the Giddings-Stone House nomination from "one" acre to 7.354 acres. We are following this procedure because the State Review Board must judge only the eligibility for the Register of the property and not the specific boundaries. The increase will include a change of the original one acre on which the house stands to 1.35 acres and the addition of two more tracts-- 2.125 acres to the north of the Giddings-Stone House and 3.879 acres to the south and east of the house. Enclosed is an exact description of the new boundary in Item #10 of the new nomination form. In addition, we have included a sketch map of the area indicating the property to be enlarged.

The two new tracts are adjacent to the Giddings-Stone House and part of the original estate, which contained 320 acres. By 1975 when the Heritage Society acquired the Giddings-Stone House from the Stone family heirs, the surrounding land, except for the 1.35 acres encircling the house, had been sold.

Originally the Giddings-Stone House was nominated only for its architectural significance, and only the land immediately surrounding the house was included. However, a housing development has begun on the surrounding lots, and this encroachment diminishes the view and sense of siting that has played an important part in the house's significance.

The Giddings-Stone House is prominently sited on a hill and is visually enhanced by the sloping green space to the north (the 2.125 acre tract). In order to protect the view of this landmark, the Heritage Society has an agreement with the developer to purchase this additional land. Their intention is to maintain the property as an open space.

The 3.879 acres to the south and east of the house is an open field and has already been purchased by the Heritage Society. This area will be used for a parking lot.



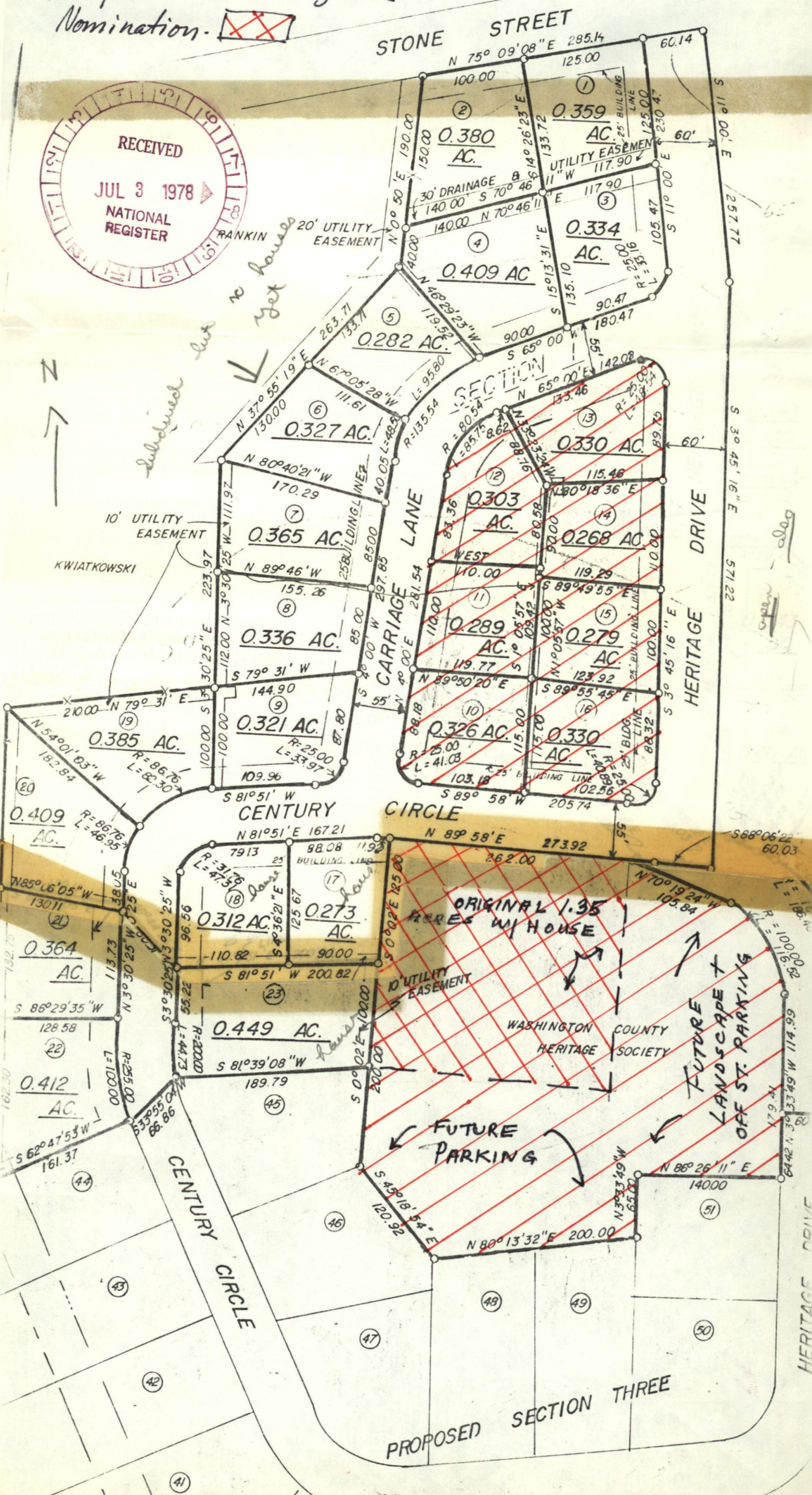

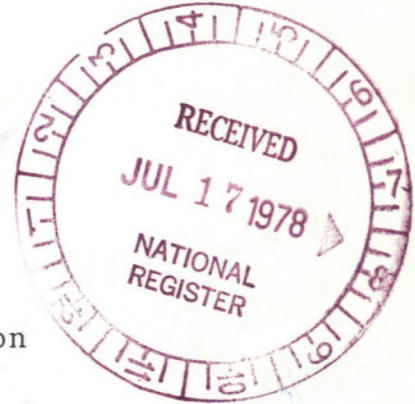

Enclosed are photographs to supplement our request of June 30 for increasing the area of the Giddings-Stone House in Washington County to 7.354 acres.

Photograph 1 shows the grassy slope north of the house. Maintenance of this vista is essential to preserving the house's character. Also visible is the modern construction already intruding from the west. The second photo shows the line of trees that will help to shield the proposed parking lot. The parking area will be landscaped so that it will not be an intrusion. This staff will approve all plans for development of the property, as part of the covenant affixed to the grant, and will monitor their execution. Photo 3 shows that much of the area proposed for parking is already open space. As many trees as possible will be saved. If parking space were not provided behind the house, cars would park in front of it on the streets, disrupting the important view from the bottom of the hill. The numbers on the map correspond to the positions from which the photos were taken.

A new map of the property is also enclosed. It was incorrectly located in the original nomination.

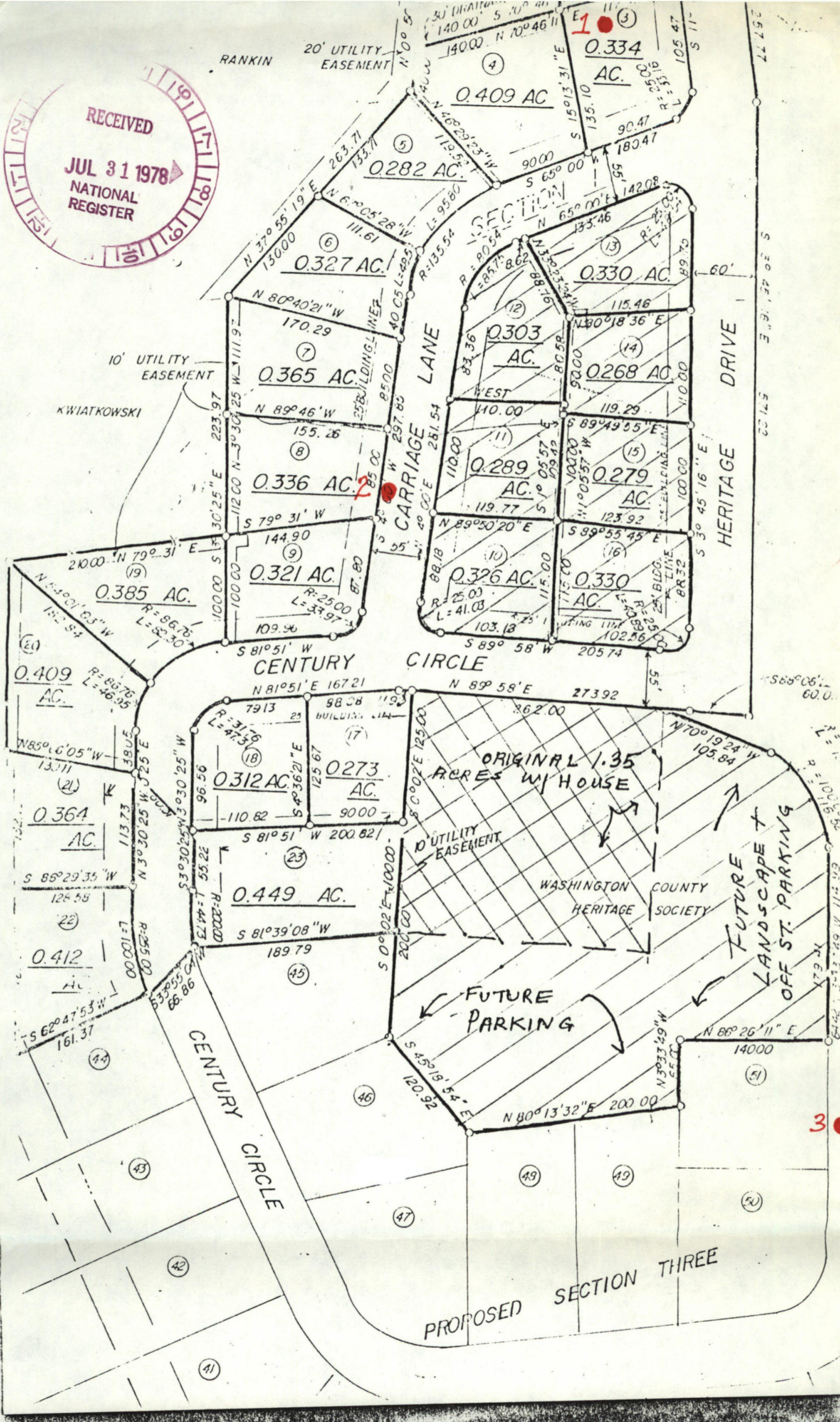

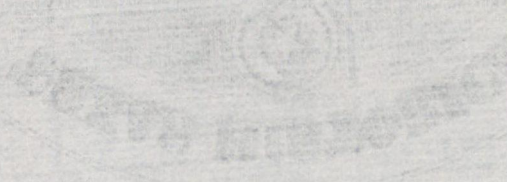
