

Waxahachie Lumber Co. (Site No. 1756) - 123 Kaufman

The Waxahachie Lumber Co. includes a complex of five structures. A site plan, attached separately, has been provided to help understand the physical relationships of the buildings to each other and also to serve as a guide in a discussion of each building's age, present appearance and classification.

Building A. This one-story structure was built about 1914 and was the company office until the lumber yard's closing in the 1970s. A detailed description of its appearance was included in the original submission. The structure stands on the same site as a two-story office building that was erected between 1885 and 1890. Because few alterations detract from its integrity, this building is classified as contributing.

Building B. This structure appears on an 1885 Sanborn map, the earliest such map made of Waxahachie. The building is one-and-a-half stories in height and has a side-gabled roof. It stands parallel to the railroad and features board-and-batten construction. Originally serving as the office, Building B has been used as a warehouse since 1890. It remains virtually unaltered and is classified as contributing.

Building C. This structure is a lumber shed and was built about 1900. It is open on both the north and south sides, thus allowing easy access to stored lumber materials. A gable roof caps the structure, which stands parallel to the railroad and is attached on the Building B. Few alterations detract from the historic integrity of Building C; therefore, it is classified as contributing.

Building D. This lumber shed was built by 1885. Unlike the other shed in the complex, this structure is open on only the north elevation. It has a gable roof and a two-tiered system of storage bins. It remains virtually unaltered and is classified as contributing.

Building E. This one-story store was built between 1885 and 1890 and is one of the oldest frame commercial buildings in the city. The "boomtown" parapet partially obscures its gable roof. Since its construction, this building has housed the lumber company's molding goods, paints and hardware merchandise. Although asbestos siding has been applied to its exterior, the building still retains the basic form of a late nineteenth-century, frame, commercial building and is therefore classified as contributing.

Areas of significance: Architecture, commerce

Period of significance: 1885 - c. 1930

The Waxahachie Lumber Company complex is a very unusual survival. While the majority of lumberyards in Waxahachie and elsewhere in the state have been remodelled or rebuilt with a degree of regularity, four of the five buildings of the Waxahachie Lumber Company retain their essential 19th century appearance. The fifth and youngest building in the complex (Building A) itself is over seventy years old and of architectural significance. It represents a remarkable adaptation of the Bungaloid style for commercial purposes, and its overscaled, bracketed overhangs are of particular note.

The lumberyard provided materials for the construction of many significant buildings during Waxahachie's historically most prosperous period from the arrival of the Texas Brazos Valley Railroad in 1887 until the World War I era, when the city's population stabilized. The lumberyard was a Waxahachie institution for almost a century.


