The Administration Building at Huston-Tillotson College is a raised, twostory, institutional structure over a full basement. The building was constructed of scored concrete block which was fabricated by industrial students at the college; the design is a modified Prairie Style. The siting of the structure on the side of a hill is dramatic, and the sense of verticality which is imparted by setting and design is reinforced by the presence of tall cedars placed near the two main entrances.

The main entrances to the building are located on the northeast and southeast corners where stairs rise to gabled entrance porches. On the northwest and southwest corners, shed-like porches overhang the two basement openings. Basement walls are constructed of cast-in-place cement which has been heavily stuccoed and which projects out from the face of the wall. Windows are double-hung, four-over-four sash with a transom awning window at the top of each opening. A horizontal concrete band runs around the perimeter of the building like a tie beam at the head of the windows on the first and second stories. A simple frieze is located under a projecting eave, and the hipped roof is covered with metal. Two tall chimneys which rise well above the roof line are located at the southwest and northwest corners.

The Administration Building has been unused for a number of years and has suffered interior vandalism as a result. Many noteworthy features, however, remain intact, including free-standing cast-iron columns and much pressed-tin decorative ceiling.

Huston-Tillotson College is a coeducational liberal-arts and sciences college which was formed by the merger of Samuel Huston College and Tillotson College in 1952. In 1914, when the Administration Building was constructed, the campus at 1820 East 8th Street was known simply as Tillotson Collegiate and Normal Institute.

While Tillotson College was created to provide Negroes with a strong liberal arts education, a large part of the pedagogical program emphasized industrial and technical training. A facility for teaching industrial classes had been constructed by 1887, and Evans Industrial Hall was largely completed by 1912.

Tillotson College made no secret of its interest in manual training and the Administration Building was a direct product of that interest. Constructed in 1914 by students trained on campus, the building was made of materials manufactured by students on the College grounds. The building derives its significance not only from the fact that it is a fine institutional example of modified Prairie style, but also because, with Evans Industrial Hall, it is a three-dimensional representation of the pragmatic philosophy of industrial arts which typified Negro education in the United States during the late nineteenth and early twentieth centuries.



Huston-Tillotson College, Austin, Texas, hereby withdraws our owner objection, dated August, 1985, to have the Old Administration Building listed on the National Register of Historic Places.

The Old Administration Building on the Huston-Tillotson College campus in Austin, Texas, is now zoned historic by the City of Austin. In 1985, the Texas Historic Commission nominated this structure for inclusion on the National Register of Historic Places. At that time, the College requested that the Commission refrain from filing the nomination.

Under the leadership of Bishop Ernest T. Dixon, Jr., a trustee of the College and a Huston-Tillotson College alumnus, a special task force of the board has been convened to discuss the disposition of the Old Administration Building. Mr. Dick Ryan and Ms. Anice Reed of the Commission have offered their encouragement to the College to seek placement of the structure on the national register.



We are in receipt of your 10 September letter, withdrawing the 1985 owner objection to listing your Old Administration Building in the National Register of Historic Places.

It is a pleasure to inform you that upon our notification to the Keeper of the National Register, at the National Park Service in Washington, D.C., the Huston-Tillotson Old Administration Building should assume its rightful place in the National Register. We will inform you of the formal listing as soon as possible, and at that time prepare a press release, with your approval, of this important event.

As you know through discussions with other THC staff members, we are highly interested in the preservation of this building. Our architectural expertise is at your disposal to examine rehabilitation possibilities for the building. We hope to meet you at the campus for a site visit soon.

Our staff has been involved with examining the state's ethnic and broad socioeconomic history for some time. One conclusion from our work is that research on and preservation of landmarks like your Old Administration Building is essential to African American history, for example, because written records are few and buildings tell quite a story when no other is available. The fact that the Administration Building and the Evans Industrial Building were constructed with student and faculty labor makes these two buildings of paramount importance to the history of your college and African American education in general.

We appreciate our renewed correspondence and confirmation of our common goal to preserve this historic landmark and a large part of the college's history. Please let us know when we may be of additional assistance.
