6. Function or Use

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7. Description

The Reichardt-Low House is a 1-story frame, L-plan dwelling with Victorian details. These details include a decorative balustrade, narrow 2/2 windows, and the asymmetrical facade and plan of the house.

The Reichardt-Low House is a 1-story frame dwelling facing west on South Austin Street in a mostly residential neighborhood developed in the late 19th Century. This L-plan house (now modified to a rectangular plan) rests on a brick pier-and-beam foundation and is covered in a hipped roof with composition shingles. Narrow clapboard siding sheaths the house. All windows are 2/2 with the exception of those on the porches which are 2/4. Wooden 4/1 decorative screens cover all windows. The long narrow lot runs a full block from South Austin Street to Church Street.

Late Victorian details include a decorative balustrade, narrow 2/2 windows, and the asymmetrical facade and plan of the house. These features are common to houses of this period and reflect a combination of influences, including Queen Anne, Eastlake, and Italianate.

The principal facade (west) is dominated by a polygonal bay front with paired windows in the center and single windows on flanking bays at the northwest corner. A noteworthy feature of this bay is the center gable that breaks the eaves above the paired window set. An inset porch at the southwest corner is supported by chamfered porch columns and a decorative sawn balustrade. Double front doors with Eastlake trim open onto the porch at the center of the house.

The owners renovated the house interior (date unknown) by lowering some of the 16-foot ceilings, adding two bedrooms on the south, closing the two fireplaces on the north facade and adding gas heat, closing the central hallway, and converting the breakfast room on the east end to another bedroom and bath. No significant exterior alterations were made except for the addition of a metal canopy extending from the front porch.

The interior of the house consists of a center hall with four rooms on the north and three rooms on the south, one separated by a porch. Pocket doors separate the music, dining, and living rooms on the north end.

Four outbuildings are on the property. A frame garage, servants quarters, and shed are Contributing; one newer garage is not.

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8. Significance

The Reichardt-Low House (c. 1880) is eligible under Criterion C for its representation of Victorian domestic architecture in Brenham. The house is an excellent example of a Victorian L-plan and retains its integrity. This property is associated with the local context "Community Development and Regional Expansion, 1870-1941."

The Reichardt-Low House was built about 1880 by the Will Reichardt family who operated a hardware store in downtown Brenham. It was purchased by T.A. Low II for his son, T.A. Low III, and bride in 1929. T.A. Low III was born in Brenham in 1903 and was appointed local postmaster by Franklin D. Roosevelt in 1933.

The property is one of the finest examples of the Victorian style in an L-plan in Brenham. Examples of Queen Anne influence are present in the plan, massing, and balustrade; the Italianate style is present in the narrow windows; and the Eastlake influence is seen on the double front doors. The window screens, however, suggest an early 20th Century update when bungalows were popular.

Overall, the property has a high degree of integrity and is in good condition.
