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### 7. Description

The W.E. Seelhorst House is a 2-story, 5-bay masonry dwelling designed in the Victorian period with largely Italianate features. Its center-passage, double-pile plan is highlighted with narrow 2/2 windows, arched window moldings, a decorative cross-hatched balustrade, and a projecting 2-story portico. Surrounded by many mature plantings, the approximately six acre site includes a large front yard and fenced pasture to the rear.

The W.E. Seelhorst House is a 2-story, 5-bay masonry dwelling facing north on approximately six acres in southeast Brenham. A hipped standing-seam metal roof covers the center-passage, double-pile plan resting on brick piers. A band of denticulation is found below the cornice while the broad eaves of the roof are highlighted by small brackets. All exterior walls are three bricks deep, 13 inches thick, and plastered both inside and out. A 1-story frame addition with hipped roof extends from the south facade. All windows are 2/2 wooden double-hung with arched window moldings and flanking shutters.

The house represents many popular Victorian architectural themes, particularly Italianate. These include the narrow 2/2 windows, slender portico columns, decorative balustrade, and overall vertical thrust and presence.

The principal facade (north) is dominated by a projecting 3-bay, 2-story portico with hipped roof supported by slender Doric columns. A cross-hatched wooden balustrade connects the columns. Double wooden doors with transom are centered on the first floor and approached by wide steps; a single wooden door is centered on the second floor. All other bays are filled with windows.

A number of large ash, pine, magnolia, and cedar trees surround the house and cover the lot. An unpaved driveway extends along the western boundary of the property to a Noncontributing garage to the southwest of the house. United States Department of the Interior National Park Service

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#### 8. Significance

The W.E. Seelhorst House (c. 1880) is eligible under Criterion C for its representation of Victorian architecture from the late 19th Century. The property is an excellent example of the style and one of the best in Brenham. The house is associated with the local context "Community Development and Regional Expansion, 1870-1941."

The W.E. Seelhorst House was built for the Seelhorst family, German immigrants, around 1880. It was sold to Adolph and Louisa Seelhorst in 1891, nephew of the original owner. They lived in the house until 1944 when it was purchased by the present owner Henry Lehrmann.

This property is an excellent example of Victorian architecture from the late 19th Century. Its vertical and symmetrical emphases are typical elements of the Italianate style. The house is one of the finest buildings in Brenham of this style. It has a high degree of integrity.




