

On the west side of the 3900 block of Avenue G, this 2-story frame dwelling that was built in 1902. As is sometimes seen on contemporaneous houses, the dwelling retains the features of Victorian-era housing coupled with details from the Classical Revival style. The house remains virtually unaltered and is in good condition.

A massive 2-story dwelling with a generally square plan, the house rests on a pier-and-beam foundation. The primary (east) facade is dominated by a 2-tier porch featuring Doric columns and turned-wood balustrades suggestive of the Classical Revival style popular in Texas during the early 20th century. A projecting 2tiered portico at the south end of the porch marks the entry bay. A Fenestration includes a single doorway with transom and double-hung wood sash with 1/1 lights. Polygonal projecting bays on the side (north) elevation alleviate the regular massing. Along with the complex roofscape of steeply pitched hipped and gable roof forms, these features are more typical of Victorian-era dwellings. Interior corbelled chimneys of buff-colored brick extend from the north and south slopes of the hipped roof. Modest changes that do not adversely affect the dwelling's historic integrity include a 2story addition on the rear (west) elevation and installation of metal awnings over the windows and the entry bay of the porch.

Constructed by builder William Voss, Sr., for Charles A. and Nancy Ann Hildreth, the Hildreth-Flanagan-Heierman House is a rare example of the transition between late 19th and early 20th century architectural forms and detailing. The house combines design elements of a Victorian-era dwelling with an exterior dominated by Classical Revival detailing. Well-known for his abilities as a designer and builder, Voss successfully blended two disparate styles in a residence that survives virtually unchanged. As a consequence, the house is nominated for its local architectural significance under Criterion C.

On September 20, 1900, Charles A. Hildreth paid \$560 for a generous tract of land comprised of lots 5-8 in Block 37 of the Hyde Park Addition (DR 163:602). After holding the property for two years, he hired master builder William Voss, Sr., who also built 4001 Avenue C and 4205 Avenue F, to construct "a dwelling house, stable and galvanized iron cistern . . . for a consideration of \$2718" (DR 130:482).

Hildreth resided in the new house for only a year before dying on February 2, 1904. His widow subsequently married Webster Flanagan, a bookkeeper and Internal Revenue Service collector, and they lived in 3909 Avenue G until Nancy Ann Hildreth Flanagan death in 1929 (Probate File No. 6970). Her will stipulated that the home be sold immediately after her death. Consequently, the executor of her estate sold the property, which had been resubdivided as lot 29 of the Shadow Lawn Addition, to Harry W. Heierman (DR 497:557).

From Massillon, Ohio, Heierman moved to Austin in the late 1880s. He joined relatives in founding Austin Foundry and Machine Shop about 1887 to manufacture boilers, engines, and brass and iron castings (Austin City Directories). The successful business eventually merged with a company owned by the Tips family and was renamed Heierman Industries (Austin <u>American</u>, February 18, 1946:2). Harry Heierman occupied 3909 Avenue G until his death on February 16, 1946 (Probate File No. 11,896) and the house remains in the family. It was zoned historic by the City of Austin in 1987 (City of Austin. Historic Landmark Inventory File C14h-74-008). \*USDI/NPS NRHP Registration Form Hildreth-Flanagan-Heierman Page#4
