The Lee House is a 1 1/2-story irregular plan frame dwelling with steeply-pitched hipped roof and a large front porch with box columns. The property is an example of the evolution of the foursquare house and shows the influence of Classical Revival in its

detailing. It faces east on a large lot in a residential neighborhood of North Belton and is surrounded by numerous small deciduous trees and shrubs.

Describe present and historic physical appearance.

While the Lee House takes the basic foursquare plan, its symmetry is broken by projecting gabled wings on its north and south sides. It is covered by a steeply-pitched hipped roof topped by massive finials and pierced by two brick chimneys. In the front pitch of the roof is a large hipped roof dormer with three windows. The house is sheathed with horizontal v-groove siding, with some use of decorative shingles around the dormer and gables. All of the windows are 1/1 double hung with wooden sashes. Running across the main facade is a large porch with box columns sheltered beneath an extension of the roof mass. The exterior of the house is in good condition with only minor alterations, however, the interior has undergone more extensive alteration.

The Lee House is a good example of the dwarf hybrid of a foursquare house sometimes known as a "pyramid house" for its prominent hipped roof. Contextually, the house is related to Community and Regional Development in Belton, specifically to the growth of Belton during the cotton boom years at the beginning of the century. The house is eligible for listing in the National Register under Criterion C, significant in the area of Architecture, as an intact example of this early century house type particularly common to Belton.

The Lee House was built in 1904 by local contractors Ben D. Lee and his son Walter J. Lee. Ben D. Lee was the contractor for the Curtis House, one of the most exuberant examples of the mansions built at the turn of the century by the town's cotton barons. It is interesting that when these contractors built a house for themselves it followed a patternbook design that would have appeared quite modern at the time, yet they added the prominent finials in a touch of Queen Anne eclecticism quite inconsistent with the house's design. The 1 1/2-story foursquare plan, or pyramid house, was being used elsewhere in Belton at this time, as illustrated by the James A. Ferguson House (site #8) built by T. Hamp Birdwell in the same year. It is an example of the new architectural influences imported to Belton via patternbooks around the turn of the century.
