Describe present and historic physical appearance.

The Morey House is a 2-story, L-plan frame dwelling with an ornate 2-story gallery running most of the length of the front facade. Designed in the Queen Anne style with Eastlake details, the house faces east on a large grassy lot near the Courthouse Square in Central Belton near other substantial Victorian-era houses.

The Morey House follows the 2-story L-plan form common to vernacular architecture, but it is highly embellished with Queen Anne detailing. Instead of the usual gabled roof, the main roof mass is hipped with gables projecting over the wing ends. The projecting bay on the main facade has chamfered corners and is topped with a prominent pedimented gable. Two interior brick chimneys with corbeled caps pierce the roof. Running along almost the full length of the front facade is a 2-story gallery with elaborate turned posts, carved balusters, and scroll-shaped brackets in the Eastlake style. The walls take a variety of finishes in the Queen Anne style: the east facade features ship-lap siding, with fish-scale siding on the spandrel between the first and second floors and on the gable pediment; the sides and rear of the structure are clad in somewhat wider lapped siding. All of the windows have wooden frames and simple hoods molds. The windows on the east and north facades are 1/1 double hung; those on the south side are 8/8. The entry door has a "Queen Anne" window with decorative perimeter glass and an overhead transom. The house has two sets of exterior stairs on the northwest and southwest corners and a small, 1-story enclosed porch on the west facade. About 1950 the house was remodeled into apartments and two sets of exterior stairs were added. It has recently been rehabilitated.

The Morey House, built about 1895, is one of the largest and best preserved of the popular Queen Anne houses in Belton. Contextually, it relates to Community and Regional Development, specifically to the growth and prosperity of Belton during the cotton boom years around the turn of the century, and the contemporaneous availability of mass-marketed house plans and manufactured details. The house is eligible for listing in the National Register under Criterion C, significant in the area of Architecture, because it typifies the popular Queen Anne house of the late 19th century.

Prominently sited near downtown Belton, the Morey House was originally one of a row of large Victorian-era residences which lined north Main Street. Because of the visibility of this thoroughfare it attracted some of the finer houses constructed late in the century. With its exuberant gallery and fine Eastlake-inspired detailing, the house ranks among the finest Queen Anne structures in Belton and survives as testimony to the prosperity of the town during the peak years of the cotton boom. The house was built for the Morey family who lived in the house until 1914 when it was purchased by Frederick William Guffy. Guffy was for many years Postmaster of Belton.
