The Austin House is a 2-story, L-plan frame structure in the Italianate style. The main facade is dominated by a 2-story porch with a projecting bowed end and a hexagonal front bay. The house faces east on a large lot in a residential neighborhood of North Belton. A number of mature deciduous trees dot the property.

The 2-story Austin House is built on an L-plan with shallow-pitched hipped roofs covering the two wings. The house rests on a pier and beam foundation that is skirted in brick. The walls of the house are clad with weatherboard and the roof is wood shingled. The classically-inspired 2-story porch is the focus of the main facade; it has simple Tuscan columns, a Renaissance Revival-style balustrade and culminates in a bowed end which projects beyond the south facade. The second level terrace of the porch has a squatter version of the balustrade. On the east and south wing ends of the house are projecting 2-story partial hexagonal bays. These are embellished with Italianate-style paneled trim beneath the windows. This trim is also carried as a frieze around the house beneath the cornice. The windows are elongated 2/2 double hung sash: those opening onto the porch are full length with simple hood molds, while those on the second floor are foreshortened and have pedimented hood molds in the Italianate manner. Along the west facade is a second story terrace. The structure is in very good condition with only minor alterations to the interior and exterior.

The Austin House is an excellent example of the High Victorian Italianate style. Contextually it relates to Community and Regional Development, specifically to the wealth accrued in Belton during the early cotton boom years. The house is eligible for listing in the National Register under Criterion C, significant in the area of Architecture, as one of the preeminent examples of Italianate design in the region.

The Austin House was built around 1885 for local merchant F. K. Austin. Austin moved with his family to Belton around 1854 and opened a grocery store on the courthouse square. In 1878, he moved the business to North East Street. Members of the Austin family lived in the house until 1950.

The Italianate style was popular in Texas from about 1860 to 1890. The style falls into two roughly chronological phases: an earlier phase with simple detailing applied to vernacular houses and commercial building forms, and a later phase with highly decorative detailing, usually referred to as High Victorian Italianate. This house, with its prominent 2-story porch and elaborate projecting bay is an intact example of the decorative exuberance of the latter phase.
