The Belton Academy/Wedemeyer House is a 2 1/2-story asymmetrical plan wood frame dwelling with a hip-and-gable roof. Though generally plain, the house has modest Queen Anne details including projecting bay windows on the south and west facades and decorative shingle finishes. The building originally had an east wing that has been demolished, but the property is otherwise in good condition with only minor recent alterations.

Describe present and historic physical appearance.

The Belton Academy/Wedemeyer House faces south on a large wooded corner lot in a neighborhood of houses from the late 19th and early 20th centuries. The 2 1/2-story structure is asymmetrical in plan and rests on a raised pier-and-beam foundation with stucco skirting. The house represents a simple vernacular Victorian-era structure with modest Queen Anne details, including a fancy butt shingle frieze between the first and second floors and a "Queen Anne" window (with decorative perimeter colored glass) on the south dormer. On the south and west facades are projecting bay windows. Entrance is via a small cutout porch at the southeast corner of the house. The building is clad with 105 wood siding and has a hipped roof with projecting pedimented gables; the roof is covered in composition shingles. On the west facade is a brick chimney. All of the windows are 1/1 double hung with wooden sashes. Currently the windows are covered with external aluminum storm windows with a diamond pane pattern that compromises the appearance of the house but is not a permanent alteration.

The Belton Academy/Wedemeyer House, built in 1891, is a good example of a vernacular Victorian-era house with simple Queen Anne detailing. Structures such as this were once very common in Belton but most have been demolished or considerably altered over the years. Contextually, the house relates to Community and Regional Development in Belton, particularly to the development of education in the city because of its early function as a private school. The house meets National Register Criterion A in the area of Education for its association with one of the early schools in Belton, and it meets Criterion C in the area of architecture as a fine example of a vernacular Victorian house with Queen Anne details.

The Belton Academy/Wedemeyer House was built for Charles Wedemeyer by well-known local builder T. Hamp Birdwell in 1891. The building originally served as both Wedemeyer's residence and housed the private school that he operated. Wedemeyer was a graduate of Baylor University in Independence, Texas, and apparently came to Belton sometime in the late 1880s. Known as Belton Academy, the preparatory school operated from about 1891 until 1911. During the first years of the school's existence the building housed the entire school; sometime later Wedemeyer relocated the school to a building (now demolished) across the street. Private preparatory schools were common in Texas during the second half of the 19th century, but few remain in recognizable condition. The Belton Academy/Wedemeyer House represents a good example of a simple vernacular late 19th century domestic building which served an additional educational function.
