Description:

The Dr. Green Davidson House is a 1-story, frame L-plan dwelling facing south on Bolton Street. It rests on a concrete pier foundation and is covered by interconnecting gable roofs of asphalt shingles. The basic L-plan configuration is altered by a rear ell and gable front wing, almost giving the impression of two L-plan houses connected at a perpendicular angle. An open L-shaped porch unifies the two parts with turned columns and simple connecting balustrade supporting a hipped metal roof. All windows are 2/2 wooden double-hung with wooden screens.

The Dr. Green Davidson House is a 1-story, frame (weatherboard) L-plan dwelling facing south on Bolton Street in a neighborhood of mostly 1930s houses northwest of downtown. It rests on a concrete pier foundation and is covered by interconnecting gable roofs of asphalt shingles. The basic L-plan configuration is altered by a rear ell and gable front wing, almost giving the impression of two L-plan houses connected at a perpendicular angle. An open L-shaped porch unifies the two parts with turned columns and simple connecting balustrade supporting a hipped metal roof. All windows are 2/2 wooden double-hung with wooden screens. Medium-sized deciduous trees and extensive shrubbery surround the house.

The principal (south) 4-bay facade is noted by a tripartite bay, each containing a window, and decorative soffit. The second bay contains a single door with transom while the remaining bays have windows; another single door with transom enter the gable front from the east. This configuration is reversed on the east facade but adds two bays with windows.

A modern garage is on the property and is considered Noncontributing.

Statement of Significance:

The Dr. Green Davidson (ca. 1900) House is an excellent example of the L-plan vernacular form. Its unusual configuration of two connected L-plans is also noteworthy. The house was moved in 1950 approximately 1/2 block and realigned to face Bolton Street. This occurred because of the expansion and widening of Richmond Road immediately to the east would have demolished the property. In spite of its move, the house is the only property of this extended form in Wharton. It is nominated under Criterion C in the area of architecture and associated with the context: Community Development in Wharton, Texas, 1875-1942.

This house was built at the turn of the century as the home of Dr. Green Davidson, one of Wharton's leading physicians. Davidson received his degree in medicine in 1889 from the Medical College of Alabama in Mobile. He moved to Wharton in 1895 and soon became a leader in the community's development. Perhaps his most significant role came in 1913 when he co-founded the Caney Valley Hospital, Wharton's first hospital. This hospital was the N.E. Moore home on Resident Street which was remodeled to include ten hospital beds, working unit, and nurse's quarters. This facility served the community until 1937 when a new hospital opened. Davidson's new hospital was the beginning of Wharton's recognition as a regional medical center.

In addition, Davidson served on the city council for seven years, acted as president of the Wharton-Jackson Medical Society, and is believed to have owned the first automobile in Wharton County (1907) and first x-ray machine between Victoria and Houston.

This house originally stood at 117 North Richmond Road but was moved to an adjacent lot in 1950 when the road was to be widened. At that time, the house was reoriented moving the principal (east) facade to face the south. The new location is also on a corner lot with a similar setting. Overall, the house retains its integrity to high degree in spite of the relocation. It remains one of the finest examples of the L-plan form in Wharton.
