Description

Building 1042 is a 1-story building that served as the brig for NAS Chase Field until its conversion into an armory in 1969. The building is in near the center of the base, at the intersections of Ofstie Road and Essex Street. The building occupies relatively level ground with minimal landscaping and plantings. With a modified T-shaped plan, Building 1042 has a concrete foundation and wood-frame construction that is covered with galbestos siding. The old brig lacks any noteworthy or distinctive stylistic ornamentation; however, the property is in good-to-fair condition and has changed very little since its construction.

Located at the east corner of the intersection of Ofstie Road and Essex Street, Building 1042 and its adjoining grounds are surrounded by a chain-link fence. The 1-story, wood-frame building has a modified T-shaped plan and a concrete-slab foundation. Galbestos siding covers the exterior walls, and the flat roof has built-up tar-and-gravel roofing material. The 2-part massing includes a 10-foot wing to the southeast (the stem of the T-shaped plan) and a 12-foot section (the top of the T-plan) from southwest to northeast. The northeast facade is marked by a small, shed-roofed porch with square posts for supports. The windows are double hung with 6/6 lights. The northeast end of the southeast elevation has a continuous series of double-hung windows with metal prison bars. This window pattern and detailing is repeated on the northwest elevation. The prison cells were in this (the northeast) section of the building. Building 1042 remains virtually unaltered on the exterior, although it was converted into an armory in 1969.

Statement of Significance

Building 1042, the Old Brig is one of the 30 surviving historic resources dating from the original 1943-1944 construction at Chase Field. Although a number of historic resources survive from the original period of construction, most have been altered — some beyond recognition — over the years. While lacking architectural distinction, the Old Brig retains its original appearance to a remarkable degree. As a result, the building conveys a clear sense of the World War II-era and the emergency military construction conditions under which it was built. The building is directly associated with the historic context, *Chase Field: A World War II Naval Auxiliary Air Station*, 1943-1946 and with the statewide context, *U.S. Military 1919-1945*. It is nominated to the National Register of Historic Places at the local level of significance under Criterion A for its historic associations with the naval auxiliary air station and its World War II-era mission.

The small, three-celled jail was built to hold naval personnel who committed relatively minor infractions of the military code. For more serious offenses, such as aggravated assault or murder, detainees were moved to the larger confinement facilities at NAS Corpus Christi. The building served as a brig until 1969, when NAS Chase Field was at the height of its jet training program and approximately 5,000 military and civilian personnel were employed at the base. At that time, a modern detention center was constructed for the base and the brig was converted to an armory.

While its use has changed, the physical appearance of the brig remains virtually the same as when it was designed by Robert & Company from standard Navy Yards and Docks guidelines for the original auxiliary air station in 1943. Although the small utilitarian building retains its integrity to a large extent, its unornamented, standard plan is not indicative of any particularly noteworthy or unique design. However, because the building's unaltered appearance evokes a strong visual sense of the World War II-era in which it was constructed, it is significant for its historic associations with the auxiliary naval air station and its mission.




