Description

Built in 1945 to house the campus library, this 3-story brick building reflects the geometric compositions favored by architectural modernism in vogue during the 1940s. The symmetrically arranged façade features a hierarchy of fenestration that draws the visitor to the main entrance. Despite changes in window materials, the building retains sufficient integrity of location, design, setting, materials, workmanship, feeling and association to remain recognizable to its period of significance.

W.R. Banks Library Building is located on L.W. Minor Street at the heart of campus activity. The building is constructed of load-bearing bricks. (see photos 1 and 2) The modestly detailed, rectangular-shaped building features a brick foundation. Cast stone bands appear at the water table, the sills and the parapet of the building. A concrete walkway leads to the entrance, which is flanked by paired windows. Large window expanses characterize the building and provide panoramic views of the campus. The interior of the library is comprised of 57,225 square feet of space.


The current vestibule originally led to a stairway that led to the lobby of the building. The library was equipped with general office areas, an art room, several alcoves for group study endeavors. Past the lobby on the right was the Stack Room. On the north wall to the left was the reference room and on the right periodicals. On the floors above were the large stacks of fiction and non-fiction books. Special attention was placed on the acoustical aspect in the reference, periodicals, lobby area, graduate and art rooms, and the stair and hallways.

The 1992 renovation of the W.R. Banks building resulted in the demolition of all interior features. (see 7-6 thru 7-8) New elevators were installed in the building, and it was made ADA accessible. Outside, special attention was given to the preservation of the historic trees surrounding the library. The library currently houses the Fiscal Affairs department, Office of Human Resources, Mathematics Department, Academic Advising and Testing.



Statement of Significance

Architect P.B Hanton designed this building in 1945 to house campus library collections in a period of expanding enrollment. Construction of the building was overseen by Dr. W.R. Banks, the visionary principal of the college. Upon his retirement in 1946, the library was renamed in honor of his tireless work on behalf of the university's financial and educational resources. This building represents the developing role of college level curriculum as a focal point of the education available on campus in the mid-20th century. The history of the building is related to the historic context, *Development of Prairie View A&M University*, 1876-1998. As the campus building most strongly associated with Bank's leadership on campus, the library is therefore nominated at a local level of significance under Criteria A and B in the areas of Education and Ethnic Heritage.

Willette Rutherford Banks was born to Jabe M. and Laura Mc Curry Banks on 8 August 1881. He and his family lived in the Northeast Georgia hills in a town called Hartwell. He overcame many obstacles to become a great center of r the Atlanta University football team, a varsity debater, a leader in the Y.M.C.A., and editor of the college paper. His college career was to give him the faithful and brilliant companion of his life, Glovinia Virginia Perry (married June 1911), and the supreme intellectual stimulation of studying with W.E. B DuBois, who remained a lifelong friend and confidant.

His record and family contacts in the C.M.E. Church brought him the presidency of Texas College in Tyler, Texas in May 1915 to 1925 where his brilliant talents as an administrator attracted national attention. Ten years later, southern leaders in the Educational Awakening suggested W.R. Banks to serve as president and on the Board of Directors of the Agricultural and Mechanical College of Texas, making him the seventh principal of Prairie View A&M College.

Believing that Prairie View College must serve the state of Texas at the point of her greatest need, W.R. Banks worked tirelessly on many fronts to make his foundation contacts overcome the provincialism that might limit the opportunity of his people. He built eight capital buildings and a model farm, the library that still bears his name; he built his staff with foundation scholarships; he got his college accredited by the Southern Association in December of 1934. Indeed, Texas became his campus and every Negro "his" student. In September 1946, he retired to a cottage that would shelter his last years. After the death of his wife in 1963, his retirement from the national stage became complete. The boards of many colleges, including his alma mater, the quiet precincts of the foundations, the national meeting of the state teachers and the Negro land grant colleges were to see the figure of the tall, gaunt, determined man no more. Willette Rutherford Banks died October 16, 1969 in his eighty-eighth year.

Mr. Banks was a trustee of several prominent institutions of higher education comprising Atlanta University in Georgia, Miles Memorial College in Birmingham, Alabama, Morehouse College in Atlanta, Georgia, Paine College in Augusta, Georgia, Texas College in Tyler, Texas. And to these accomplishments can also be

attributed president of the Negro Land Grant College President's Association (1934-35), president of the Texas Historical Commission Association of Negro Colleges (1934-37) and author of *The Negro in Texas* (The Book of Knowledge, Vol. 21, 1928). Other accomplishments included his teaching at Fort Valley Industrial School in Benson, Alabama (1909-12), principal of Kowaliga Industrial School also in Benson, Alabama (1912-15). Mr. Bank's philosophy of education was once stated tersely as: "Education should strive to serve citizens at the points of their greatest needs; and bring the training of students into closer relationship with their life's occupations and conditions" (From Progress for Twelve Years of the Agricultural and Mechanical College of Texas).

Summary

During his administration, principal Banks made many progressive steps in development of the institution, such as, all graduates were recognized by the State Department of Education in practically every state in the Union, it received a Class "A" rating with the Southern Association of college and Secondary Schools, while holding an active membership in the American council of Education. In addition, its hospital was recognized by the American College of Surgeons and the American Hospital Association, Prairie View's graduates were admitted without examination to the Graduate Divisions of the leading colleges in the country and its off-campus activities embracing Agricultural Extension, Vocational Agriculture, and Home Economics, Trades and Industries, Extension and Correspondence School had more than tripled in size and usefulness. The W.R. Banks Library represents the work of Mr. Banks. And its construction in 1945 reflects the expansion of the A&M university system. The history of the building is related to the historic context, Development of Prairie View A&M University, 1876-1998. It is therefore nominated to the National Register of Historic Places under Criteria A and B in the areas of Education and Ethnic Heritage at a local level of significance.


BOUNDARY JUSTIFICATION
