

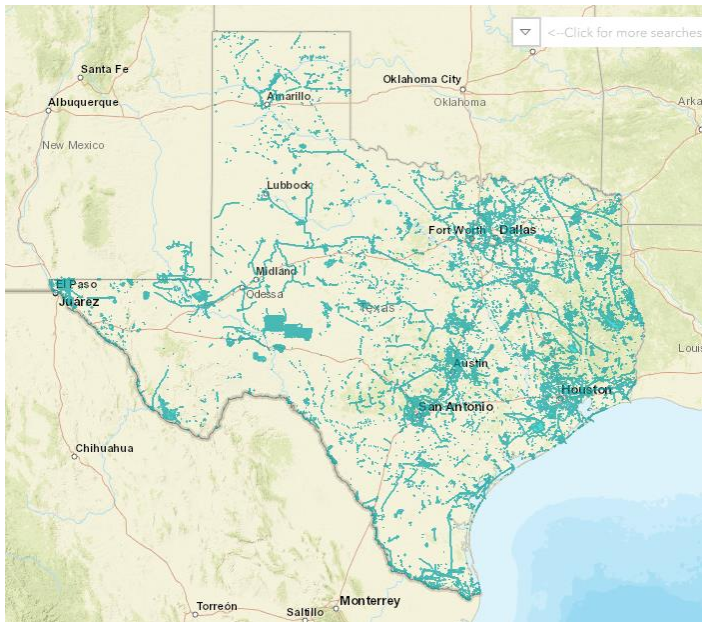
Texas Archeological Sites Atlas Best Practices

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Clicking on the Archeological Log In

- When you go to the Texas Archeological Sites Atlas Map page **WAIT** until the turquoise draws across the whole state of Texas before you click, zoom, move, or interact with the map. If you do click, zoom, or interact with the map reload the page and **wait** for the turquoise to draw across the whole state of Texas. If you wait, then the map has time to load all the features through the security.



- The Layer List with Legend  only shows the layers that are displayed at that zoom level. If the layer name is greyed out, then it is not visible at the zoom level. More layers show up the more you zoom in. The archeology site labels are last to display. Drawings only display if you have created a graphic using the Sketch tool.
